- The goal of the Recommended Practices is to inform and improve the quality of services provided to young children with or at risk of disabilities or delays and their families.



DEC Recommended Practices



The DEC Recommended Practices provide guidance to practitioners and families about the most effective ways to improve the learning outcomes and promote the development of young children, birth through age 5, who have or are at-risk for developmental delays or disabilities.

Developed by the DEC Recommended Practices Commission.

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DEC Recommended Practice Parameters



- Represent breadth of topic
- Observable
- Represent "high-leverage" practices
- Not disability specific or limited to those with disabilities
- Delivered in all settings (natural/inclusive environments)
- Build on and are not duplicative of other standards (such as NAEYC DAP)
